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INTRODUCTION

National Parks and Sanctuaries are becoming progressively critical as repositories of living natural resources. Unfortunately, comprehensive data on the current status and needs of all the protected areas in the country is not available. The collection of such data on a country-wide basis would help in developing policies, programmes and budgets to support, more effectively, efforts at protecting and managing these areas.

- 2. With this in mind, the Central Department of Environment has sponsored an All-India Survey of National Parks and Sanctuaries, as a first step to collating and analysing all the relevant information. Briefly, the objectives of this survey are:
 - (a) To collect and collate, in a uniform format, information regarding each National Park and Sanctuary in terms of its legal status; management plans and practices; geographical, biological and social parameters; research and education activities; and financial outlays.
 - (b) To solicit the views and suggestions of the Chief Wildlife Wardens and of the Park/Sanctuary Directors, regarding the better management and future expansion of these protected areas.
 - (c) To analyse all this information and make available, to the Chief Wildlife Wardens, the State Governments and to the National Parks and Sanctuaries, a detailed compilation of this information, covering all the Parks and Sanctuaries in the country.

- 3. The Department has requested Smt. D.S. Variave, former member of the National Committee for Environment Planning and member of the IUCN Education Commission, and Shri Shekhar Singh of the faculty of the Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi, to undertake this work. They have, in consultation with the Department, prepared two questionnaires: Questionnaire I to be filled in by the Director of each National Park/Sanctuary and Questionnaire II to be filled in by the Chief Wildlife Warden of each State/Union Territory.
- 4. Both these questionnaires may kindly be filled in and mailed direct, by Registered Post, to:

- 5. Apart from making a copy available to all Chief Wildlife Wardens, to the State Governments and to each of the National Parks/Sanctuaries, a copy of the final report will also be made available to each Park/Sanctuary Director, whose filled in questionnaire is received in time to be included in the report.
- 6. As we hope, in the near future, to build up a data bank regarding National Farks and Sanctuaries, we very much look forward to your suggestions and co-operation in this task.
